FOREWORD

To be recognized as an ASEAN Premier State University is Pangasinan State University's (PSU) impetus to continuously strive to become what it envisions. This is to say that despite the struggles and hurdles, we have remained committed towards the achievement of our goals.

The year 2018 is a testament to this commitment. Varied awards and recognitions have been bestowed to us acknowledging our potential and strength not only in the academic arena but also in our standards of management and brand of leadership.

Aside from being tagged as the first state university in the country to be Multi Campus ISO 9001:2015 certified by the internationally renowned AJA Registrars Inc., PSU has been endowed with a Silver Award by the Investors in People, and named as one of the top ten Performing State Universities in the Philippines by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines, Inc. (AACUP). This is also to say that we have submitted ourselves for evaluation in two prestigious recognitions given by the Philippine Government - the Philippine Quality Award and the Institutional Sustainability Assessment.

The university has thus maintained exemplary performance in our four-fold function along instruction, research, extension and production.

In instruction, the University did not only sustain the Center of Excellence status in Fisheries and Teacher Education programs but has submitted majority of its curricular program offerings (both in the undergraduate and graduate level) to accreditation and certification for program compliance by the Commission on Higher Education. Performance in board examinations is sterling. Three Fisheries graduate of the University top notched in the October 2018 Fisheries Technologists licensure examination. Electrical Engineering program has maintained a one hundred percent passing rate.

Linkage with the Southeast Asian Minister of Education, Organization, Innovation and Technology (SEAMEO) is reinforced through the SEA-Teacher and SEA-TVET Projects accommodating more than fifty foreign exchange student-teachers from Thailand, Indonesia, and Vietnam. The institution also fortified its partnership with the National Network of Normal Schools of the Philippines by participating in the year-long Curriculum Quality Audit process with University of England, Armidale.

We also now hold chairmanship of the Philippine Consortium for Science, Mathematics and Technology Council.

In research, more than one hundred researches is approved by the University in 2018. Eighteen of these researches are published in accredited journals by CHED and eighty one have been completed. The University hosted a number of symposia and conferences like the 5th Regional Agriculture and Fisheries Extension Network, the Statistics Training Workshop, and Research and Development Symposium participated in by other educational institutions and external agencies. Active engagements in national and international research conferences like the 3rd ICODEI 2018 in Kaoshiung, Taiwan, and 14th International Conference on Social Sciences in Frankfurt, Germany were made.

Ties with Department of Science in Technology have been strengthened through the Food Innovation Center. Collaborations with Commission on Higher Education and

University of the Philippines are sealed to make researches funded by the Philippine California Research Institute.

In extension, engagements of the University with the community are recognized as it received the “Sambayanang Itinataguyud and Kaalamang Agrikultura at Pangisdaan (SIKAP) from the Agricultural Training Institute. Extension projects covered by forty memorandum of understandings and agreements have been jumpstarted with local government units and other external agencies extending trainings to almost five thousand individuals.

In production, there is almost one hundred percent increase in the income of the University in a span of two years. From 5, 248, 705.52 in 2016 it doubled up to 10, 109, 879.27 in 2018. The increase in income yielded from the concerted efforts of all campuses of the University in bolstering its income generating projects.

The University has also been a hub to eighteen benchmarking activities by private and public Universities for them to learn from our best practices in the field of budget, research and extension programs, international linkages, program curriculum, accreditation and quality assurance. Fora has also been organized and spearheaded by the University centering on youth empowerment and stakeholders’ involvement in decision making.

The budget of the University has significantly increased from 630 million last year to 700 million this year.

The realization of these achievements is what propels us to become better. The challenges that we still have to go through are what impel us to be in solidarity. The interest of our stakeholders is what drives us to be at our best.

Our commitment does not end where we began. Instead we go beyond with what we have set. These and those which are yet to come lead towards reaching the zenith of our vision.

May we always serve the best interest of the many!

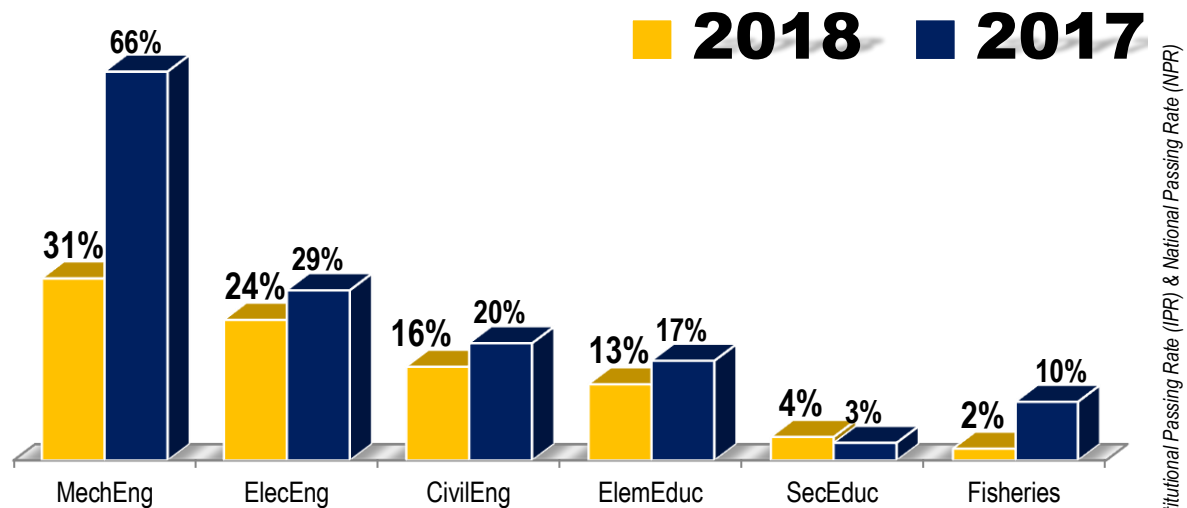

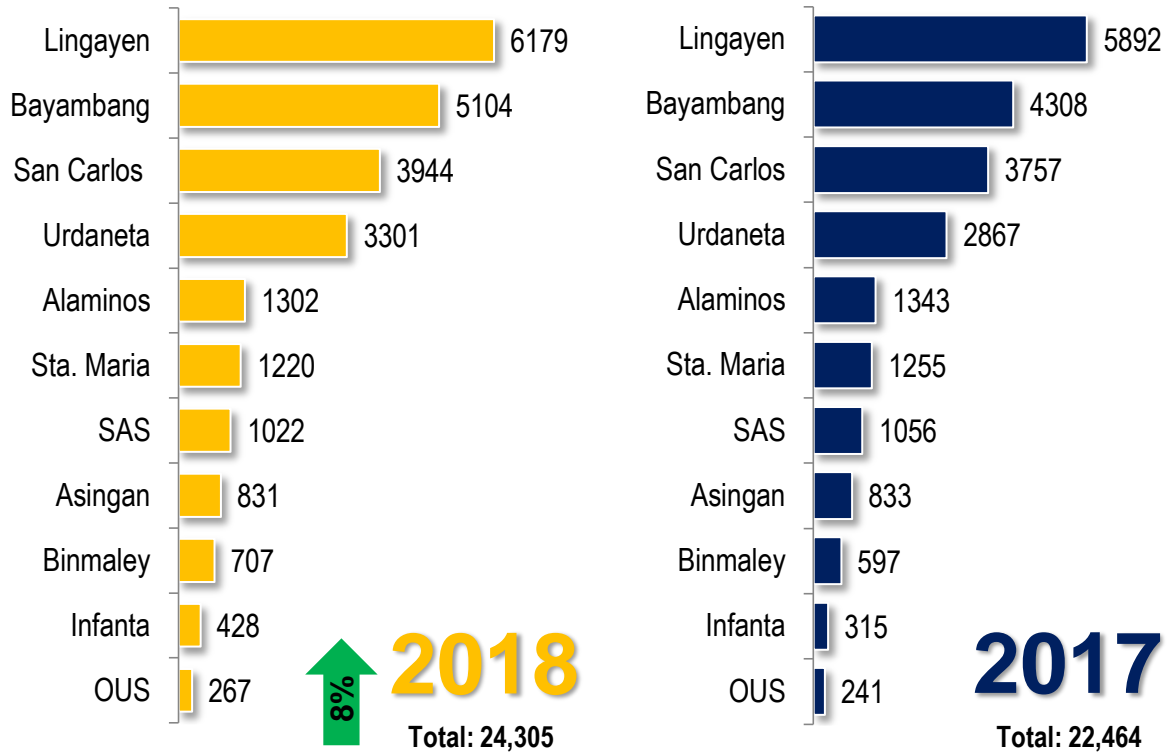

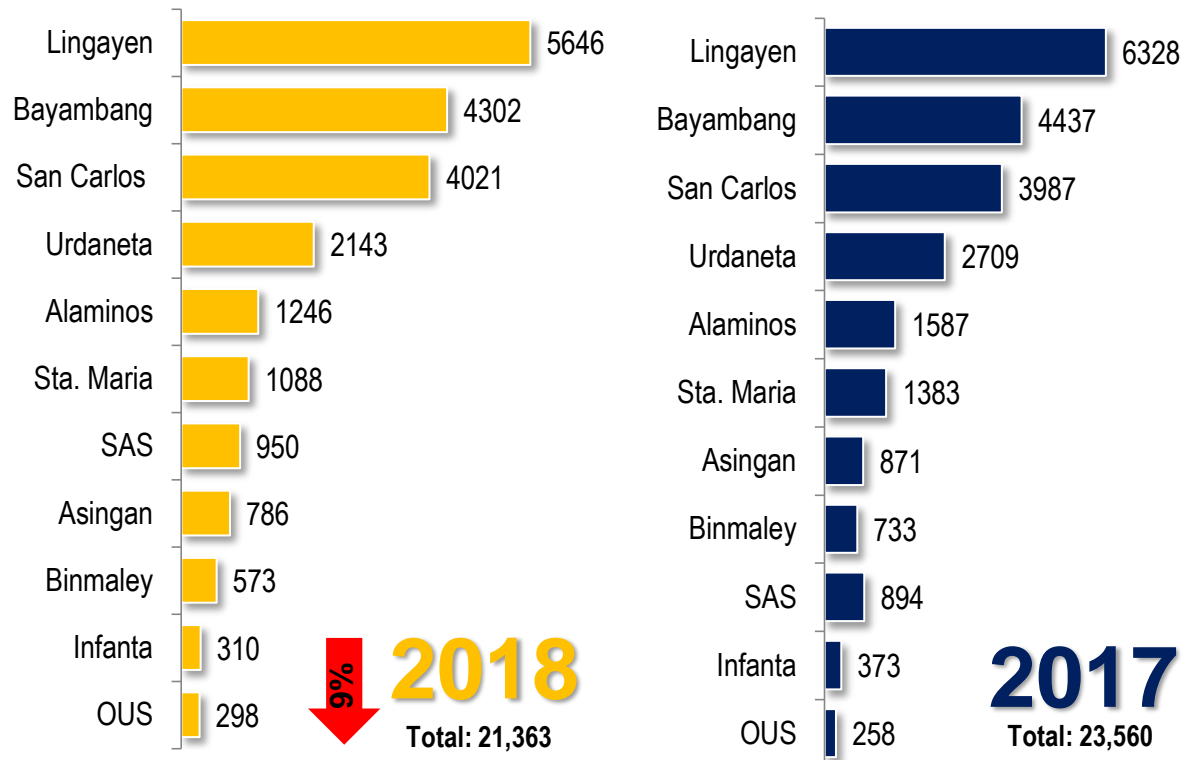
STUDENT POPULATION BY CAMPUS

First Semester

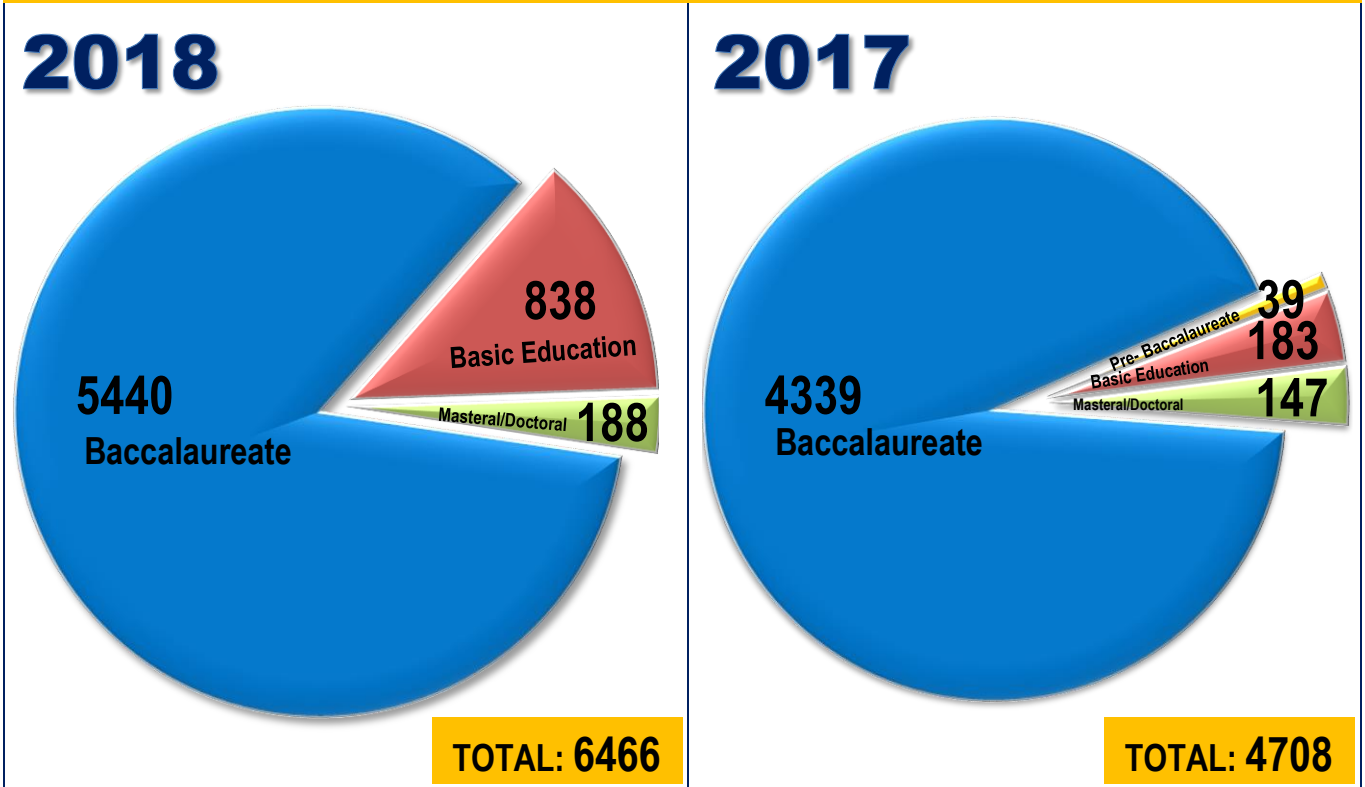


STUDENT POPULATION BY CAMPUS

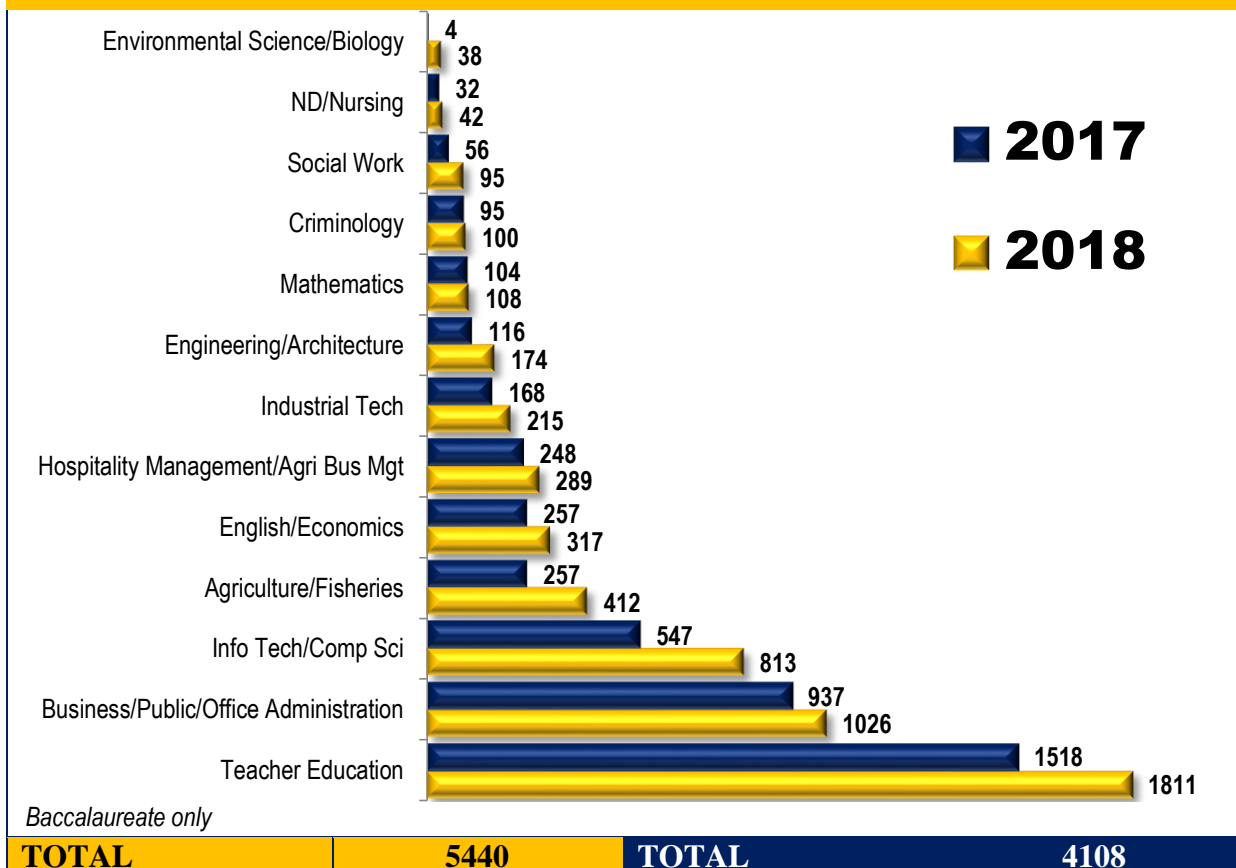
Second Semester

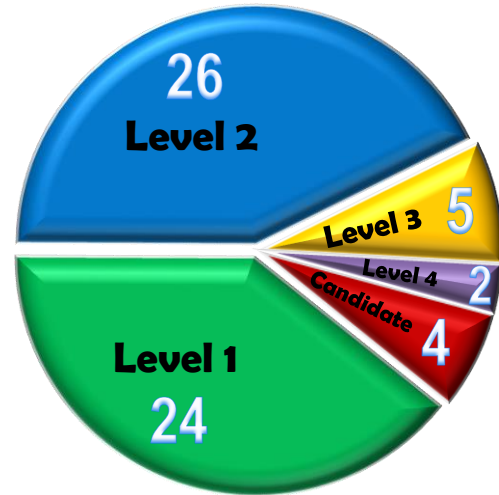


GRADUATES BY CLUSTERED DEGREE PROGRAMS

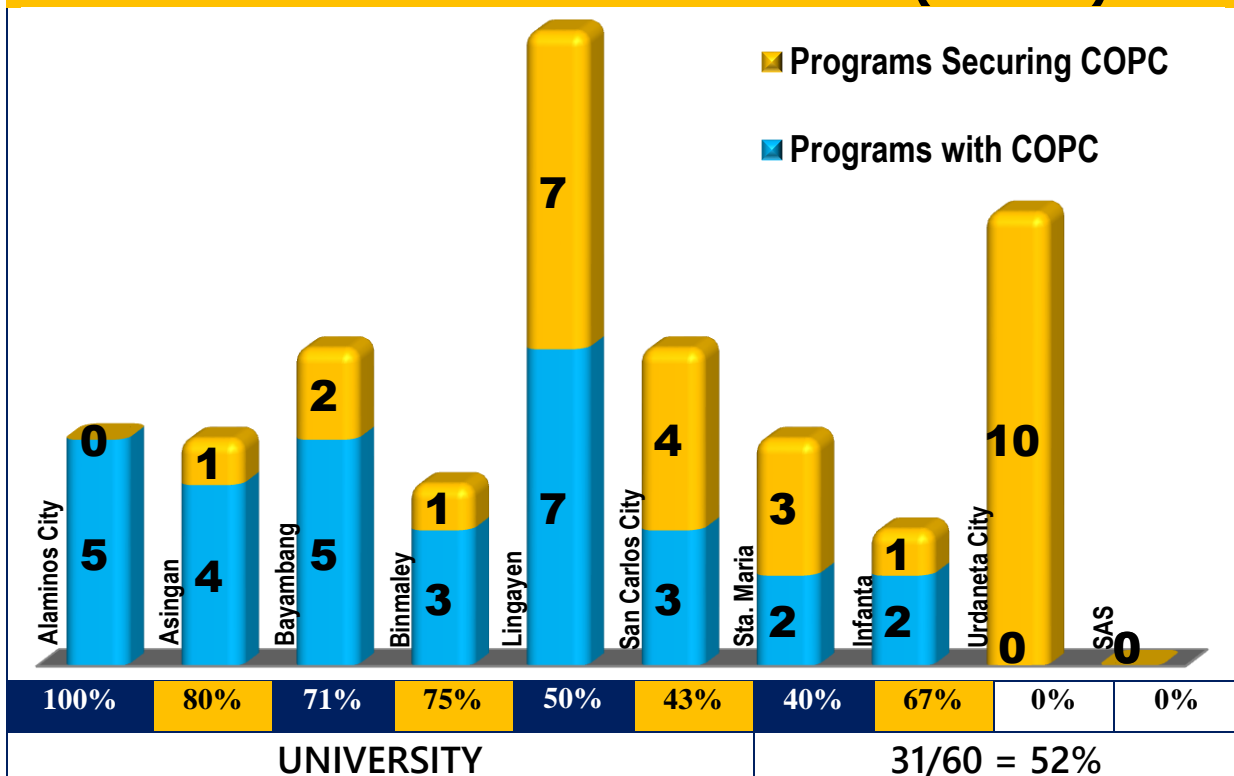

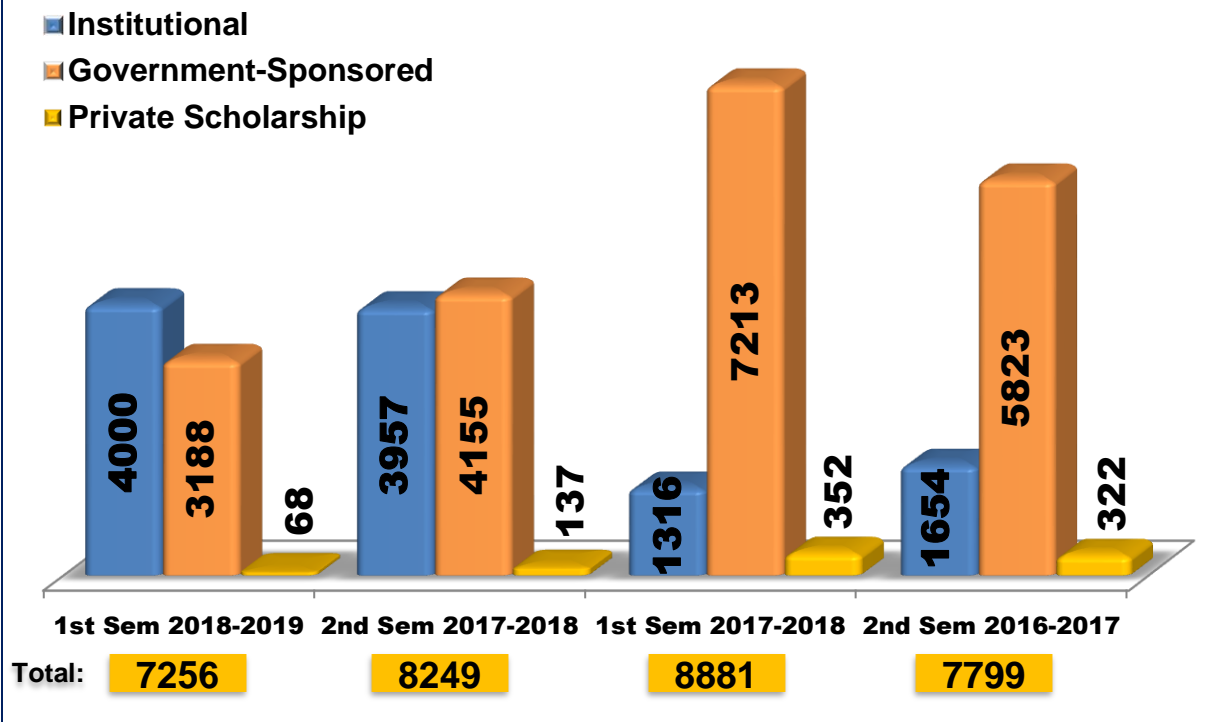
FACULTY PROFILE BY EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT



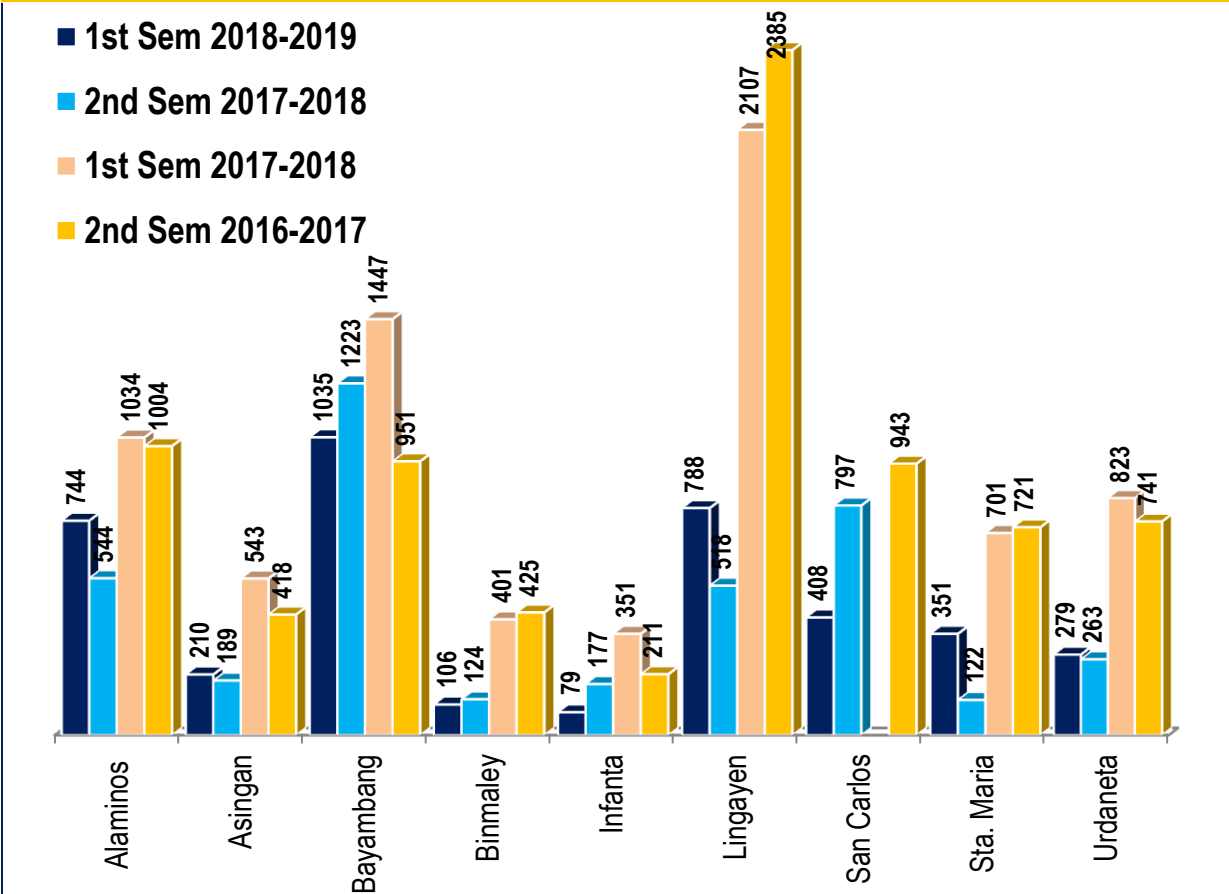
ACADEMIC RANK OF FACULTY W/ PLANTILLA ITEMS

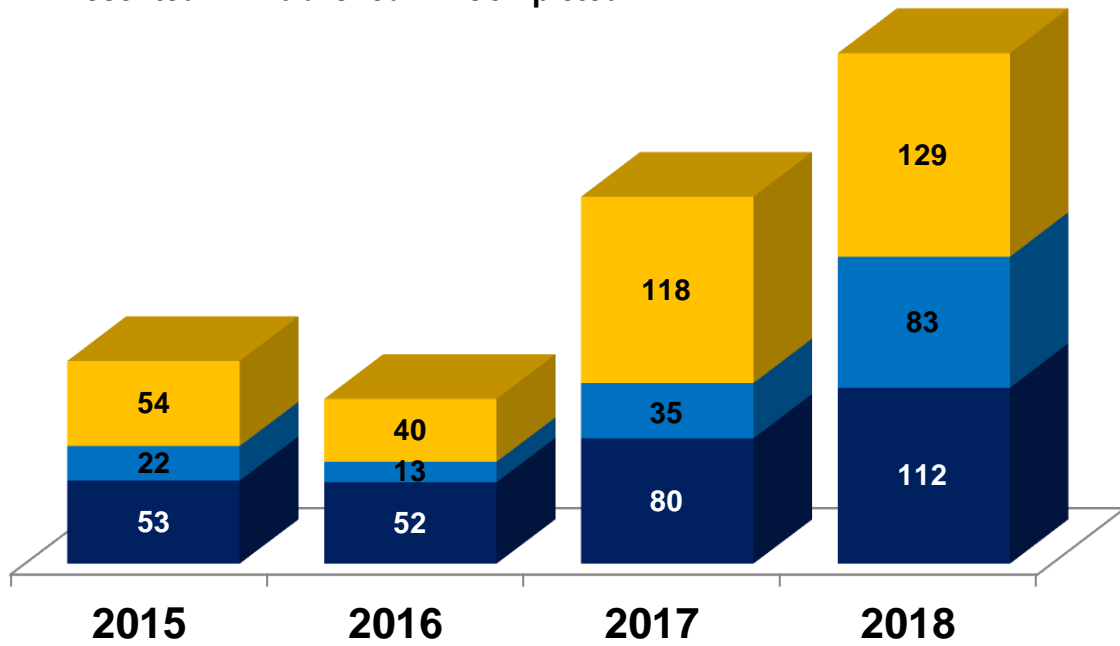

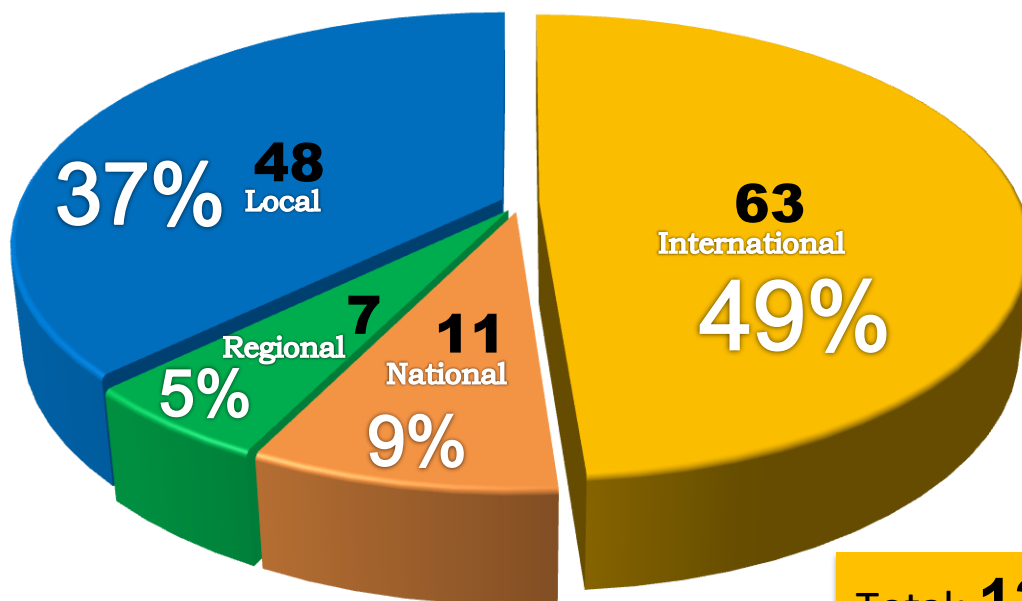

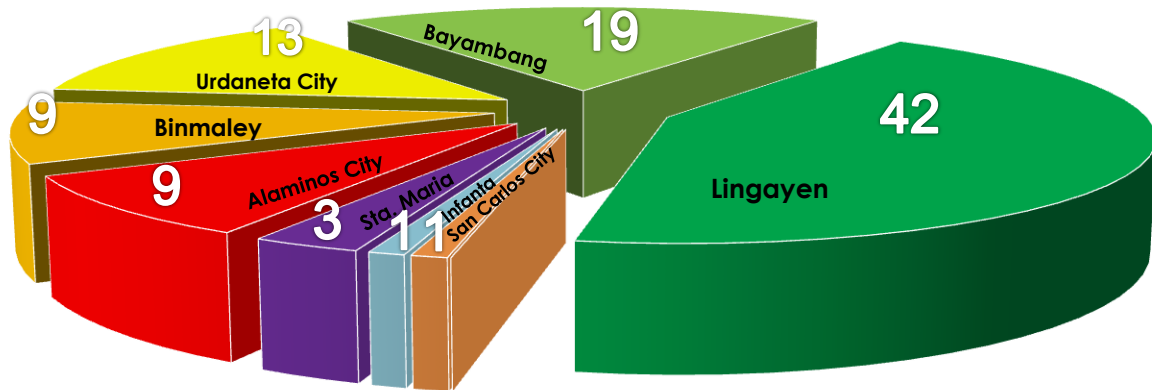

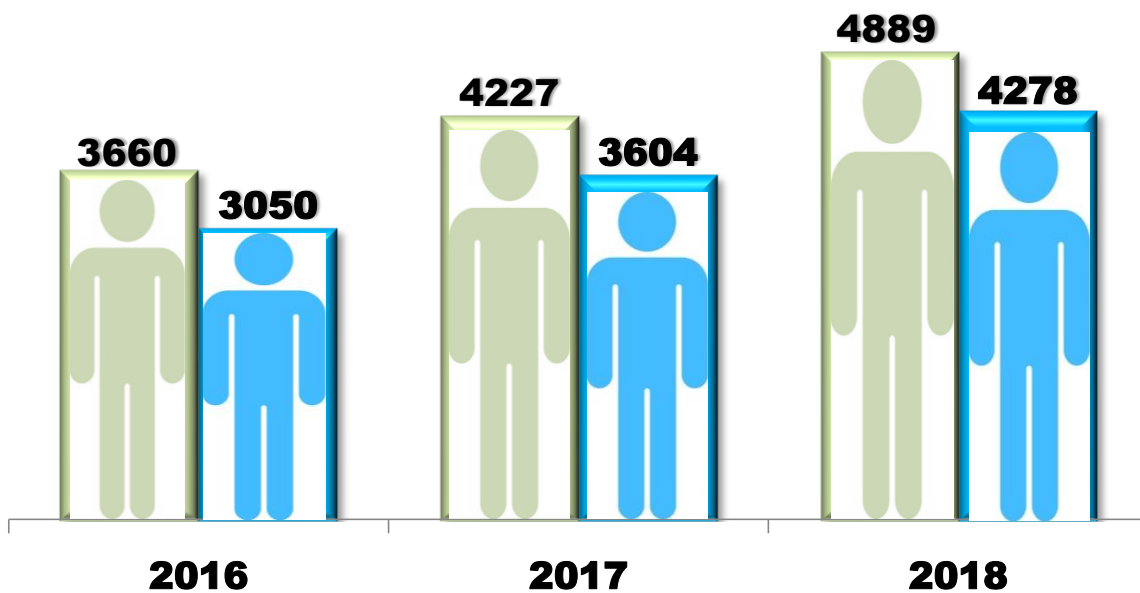

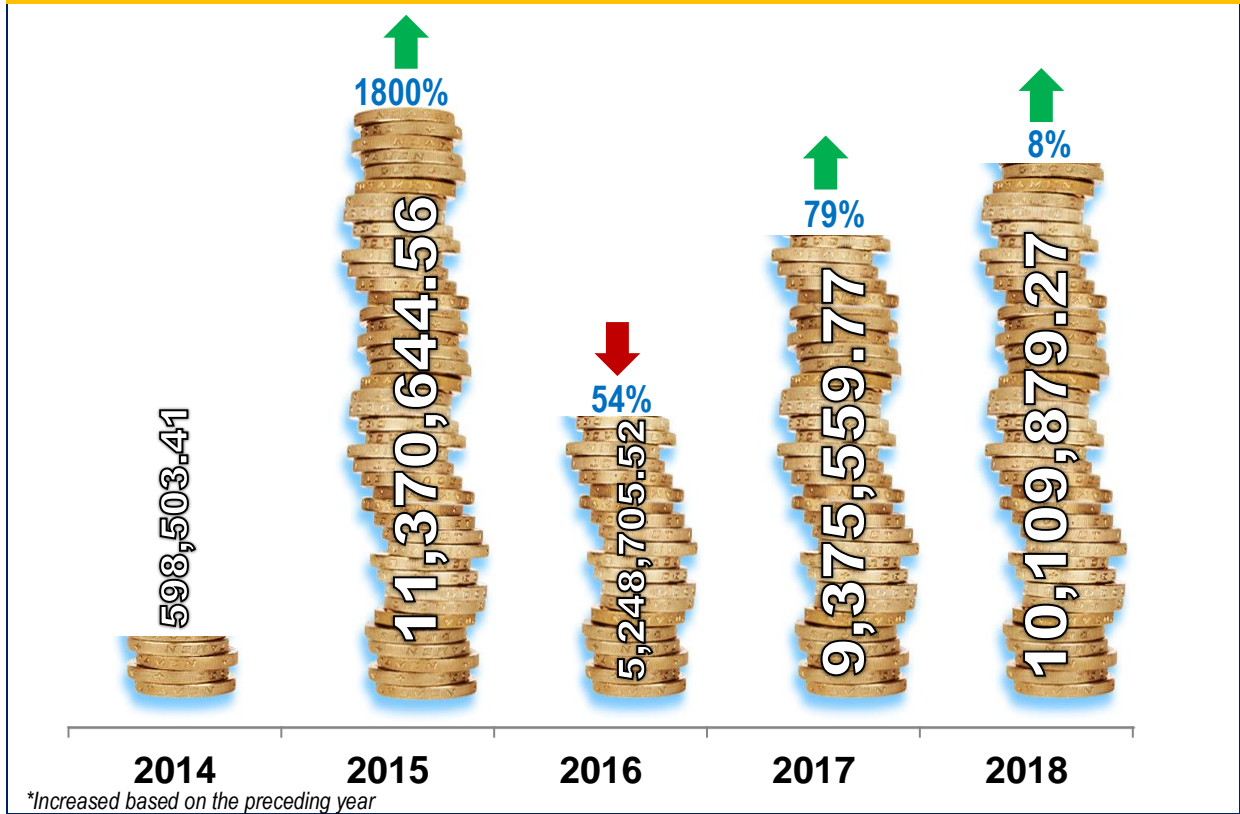

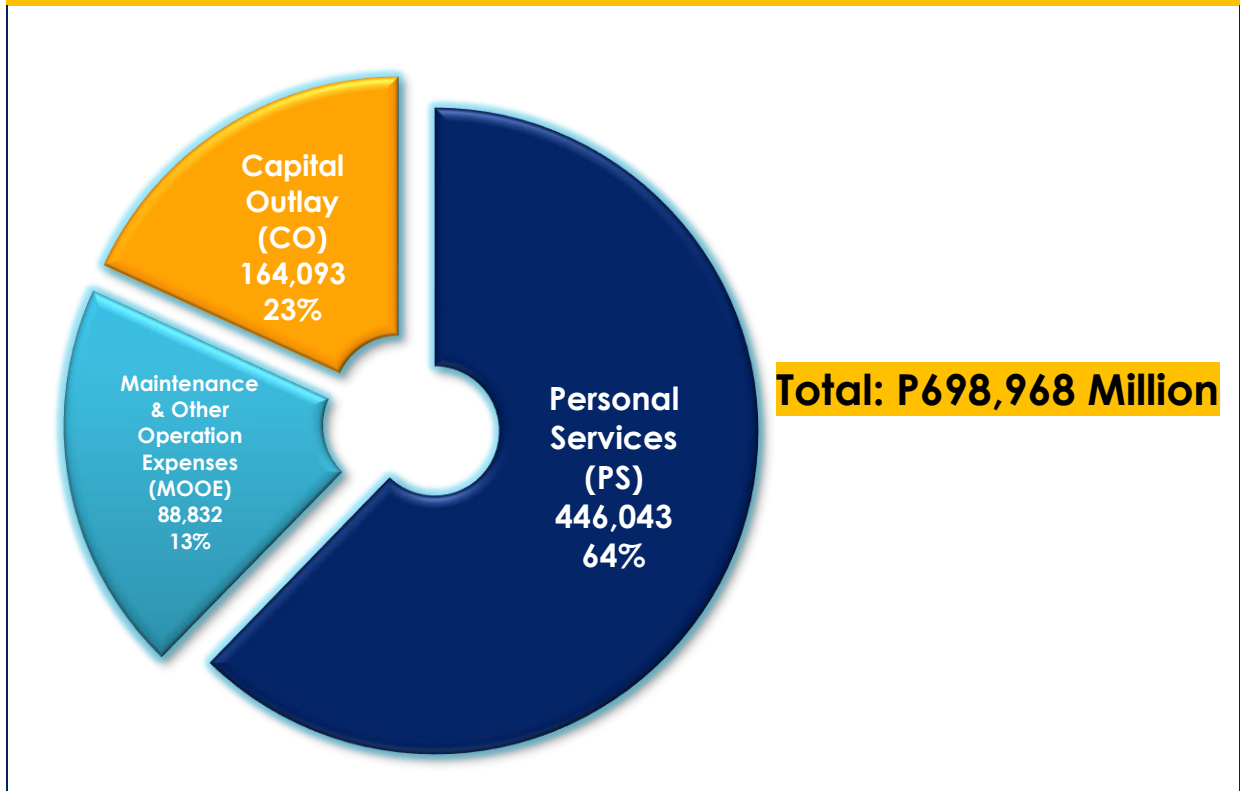
- ▣ Persons Trained Weighted by Length of Training

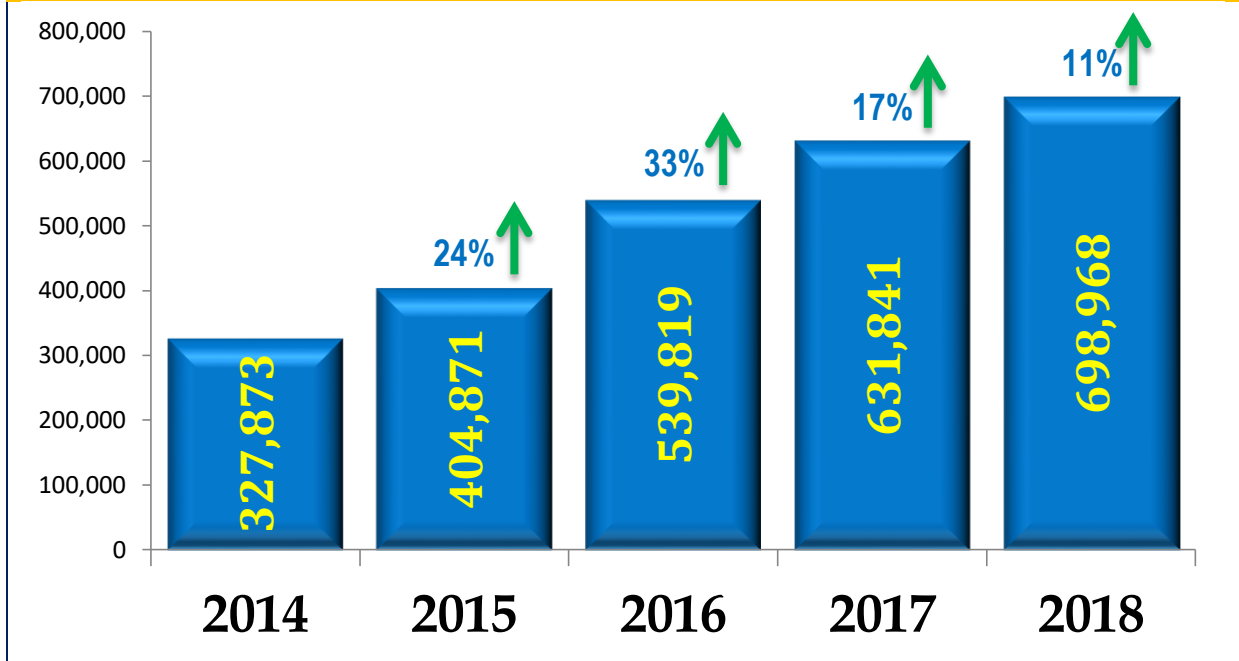
INCOME GENERATING PROJECTS



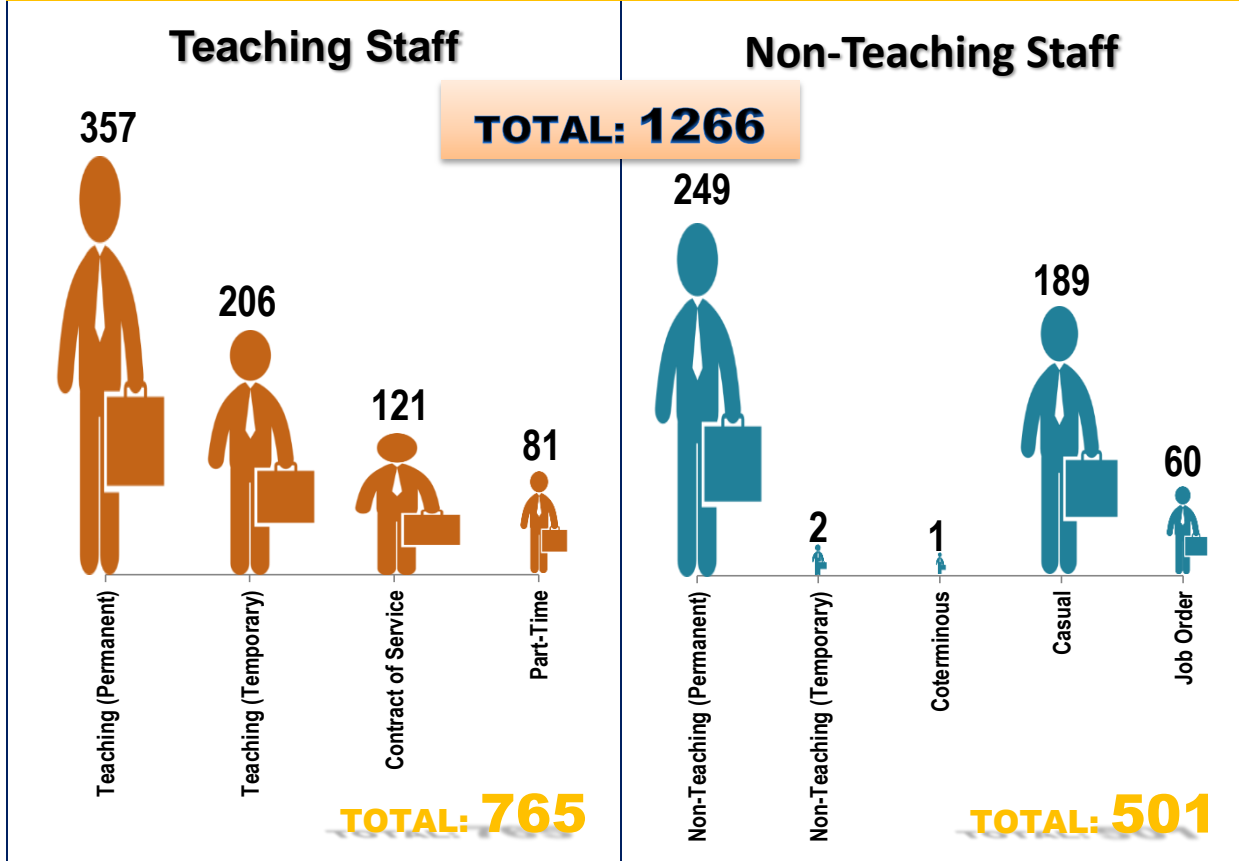
2018 BUDGET BY OBJECT

PSU produces 6,000 graduates in 2018



Around 6,200 graduates marched during the Pangasinan State University's 39th Commencement Exercises last June 26-27, 2018 for the Open University Systems (OUS) and School of Advanced Studies (SAS) graduates held at the PSU Convention Hall, Lingayen Campus and June 28-29, 2018 for the baccalaureate graduates held at the CSI Stadia, Lucao, Dagupan City.



The graduates were confirmed by the PSU Board of Regents after successfully complying with all requirements of their respective academic programs in the undergraduate, masters and doctorate levels.



Forty two among the undergraduate students finished with Latin honors (11 Magna Cum Laude and 33 Cum Laude). The Magna Cum Laude awardees were: Lyra Mhay C. Barril, from Alaminos City Campus, Rodney B. Gundayao, and Arlo Vincent M. Ranque from Bayambang Campus, Jomark V. Parana from Binmaley Campus, Kenneth S. Caasi, Jasmine H. Soriano, and Jules Marc R. Garcia from Lingayen Campus, Chris Mark C. Aquino, Roldan I. Dela Cruz, and Arsenio G. Frias Jr. from San Carlos City Campus, and Karen M. Boston from Sta. Maria Campus.



With the number of PSU baccalaureate graduates, the ceremony was conducted in three batches. The first batch was held at 8:00 in the morning of June 28, 2018 which included Lingayen and Infanta Campus, the second batch has Binmaley, San Carlos and Urdaneta Campus which started at 4:00 in the afternoon. The third batch, held on June 29, 2018 included Alaminos, Asingan, Bayambang, and Sta. Maria Campus.



PSU invited four distinguished Commencement Speakers. The first batch was graced by Sec. Harry L. Roque, the eloquent former spokesperson of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte. Roque was then a member of the Legislative Department of the government who authored/co-authored laws intended to significantly impact the lives of the Filipino people.



Hon. Pilar Juliana "Pia" Cayetano, Senator of the Republic of the Philippines also cheered the graduates as she delivered inspirational message. It is through the notable efforts of the Honorable Senator that Php2 Billion (*Php18 Million per SUC*) was made available to 111 SUCs in the country augmenting the funding for their projects.

Meanwhile, Hon. Prisco S. Rivera, Jr., Director III, from the Civil Service Commission, Central Office graced the second batch of graduates with his heartwarming and encouraging message.

The third batch was led by Hon. Maria Imelda Josefa "Imee" Romualdez Marcos, eldest daughter of former President Ferdinand E. Marcos and former First Lady Imelda Romualdez-Marcos. Marcos was awarded a Medal of Distinction for her significant achievements in public service from the Golden Globe Annual Awards Council (GGAAC).

"*Kredibilidad at Integridad: Tugon sa Kagaligang Global ng ASEAN,*" this year's theme stressed the need for the graduates to not only perform their work with credibility and integrity but to always be ready to transform themselves and become resilient and competitive in today's globalized world, as mentioned by Hon. J. Prospero E. De Vera III in his message to the graduates.

PSU EE maintains 100% Passing Rate

Pangasinan State University's College of Electrical Engineering garnered a 100% passing rate in the April 2018 Registered Electrical Engineer (REE) and Registered Master Electrician (RME) Board Examinations.

Two first-time examinees – Engr. Kevin Carlos A. Nacino and Engr. Mary Claire R. Salioa, upheld PSU's prestige for the Registered Electrical Engineer (REE) examination. The two new successful engineers mentioned, along with Engr. Joseph Daniel I. Santos also passed the Registered Master Electrician (RME) Board Examination conducted on the same month.

The performance of the campus in both examinations also exceeded the national passing rate of 52.12% and 50.08%, respectively.

Lastly, Engr. Michael Bascos is the 5th Professional Electrical Engineer the campus has produced.

These successful students are Mr. Elmer B. Abarra (Top 2), Mr. Jomark D. Parana (Top 5) and Ms. Laila U. Ubando (Top 7) who proved that the University can be lined up with UP Visayas-Iloilo and other higher educational institutions offering fisheries course

Pangasinan State University garnered an overall passing rate of 29.17% for the said licensure examination which surpassed the national passing rate of 28.31%. Amongst these passers were first time takers with a passing rate of 35.54% which is higher compared to the national passing rate of 35.01%.

Performance on Licensure Examination

While Pangasinan State University celebrates the success of its topnotchers, the university also recognizes the achievement of Licensure Examination passers from other academic fields.

Last August 2018, PSU garnered 50% passing rate on the Agricultural Engineering Licensure Examination; 21.43% passing rate on the Nutritionist-Dietician Licensure Examination (August 2018), and 32.59% passing rate on the Licensure Examination for Teacher Education - Elementary Level (September 2018) which is higher than the 20.29% national passing rate. Likewise, PSU has obtained 55.28% passing rate exceeding the 48.03% national passing rate on the Licensure Examination for Teacher Education - Secondary Level (September 2018).

Meanwhile, in the Civil Engineering and Nursing Licensure Examinations, PSU got 60.56% and 68.56% respectively, exceeding the national passing rates of 45.11% and 39.99%.

The topnotchers and all passers were awarded with certificates of recognition.

PSU ranks 7th Nationwide

Pangasinan State University-Urdaneta City Campus was included as one of the top performing colleges and universities based on a survey posted by *finduniversity.ph*.

With a passing rate of 91.6%, PSU-Urdaneta ranked 7th alongside University of the Philippines Diliman as 1st (98.2%); University of the Philippines-Los Baños as 2nd (97.6); while Ateneo de Manila University (ADMU) secured the third spot with 96.9%. Also in the rank are University of the Philippines Manila- 4th (96.0%) and University of the Philippines Visayas who landed on the 5th place with 92.0% followed by De La Salle University on the 6th place with 91.7%.

Further, Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP) - Sto. Tomas placed 8th with 88.7%, University of Sto. Tomas (UST) and Ateneo de Davao University secured the 9th and 10th place with passing rates of 88.5% and 87.4%, respectively.

In both graduate and undergraduate degrees, PSU Urdaneta showed a commendable performance in board examinations evident in the passing rate list of first-time examinees as seen below:

PSU ranks 17th Best Mechanical Engineering Schools in PH



Pangasinan State University Urdaneta City Campus ranked 17th in this year's ranking of best Philippine schools to study mechanical engineering, according to an article posted by College Tips (@collegetipsph) on September 2, 2018.

PSU obtained a weighted passing percentage average of 94.73% with a total of thirty eight examinees. Its Mechanical Engineering program is currently accredited Level II status by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines, Inc. (AACUP).

The ranking was initiated and crafted by Localpulse (www.localpulse.net) which included thirty nine of the nation's top mechanical engineering

schools, based on overall board exam performance which includes number of examinees and top performing examinees and other factors.

Localpulse used the weighted average of percentage ratings of the examinees who passed the mechanical engineer licensure examinations in February and August, 2018 as the key factor to determine the ranking. The passing rates were also adjusted to 60% and above unlike Philippine Regulatory Commission's (PRC) 80%, and a minimum of twenty examinees unlike PRC's fifty minimum examinees.

The list was further narrowed down by incorporating crucial factors, such as school's total number of examinees for the year, accreditation status, and faculty-student ratio of the schools.

PSU emerges 1st Runner-Up at 14th RSCON

Pangasinan State University's Engineering students were hailed as 1st Runner-Up in the 32nd IIEE-CSC Regional Quiz show during the 14th Regional Student Conference (RSCON) held last September 27-28, 2018 at the Columban College Inc., Main Campus, Olongapo City.

The conference was an annual activity being held to engage Electrical Engineering students in seminars, conventions and quiz shows.

Lady Fishbone wins grand prize at 2018 Maningning Miclat Art Awards

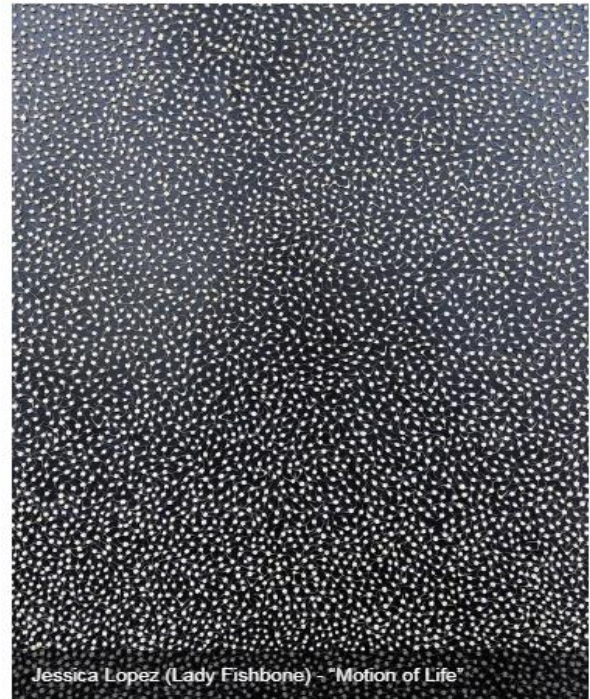
Jessica Lopez, dubbed as Lady Fishbone from Pangasinan State University was named this year's Grand Prize winner for her work "Motion of Life" during the 2018 Maningning Miclat Art Awards on September 26, 2018.

The Maningning Miclat Art Foundation Inc. (MMAFI), in cooperation with District Gallery and Far Eastern University's President's Committee on Culture unveiled its art exhibit last September 4, 2018 at the Exhibit Hall, Nicanor Reyes Hall of Far Eastern University (FEU) in Manila featuring the shortlisted finalists from the 64 qualified entries received online.

"I started to experiment with fish bones way back in October 2014 when I was one of the art facilitators of the First Youth Art Camp in Lagawe, Ifugao. I was having lunch with a teacher one time, and she shared that within a fish is a fish-shaped bone," said Lopez. Upon realizing what the teacher meant, she started picturing the idea of using fish bones in her artwork.

Home after the workshop, Lopez stored all the bones left from their meals while her father helped her acquire more from vendors of boneless *bangus* (milkfish). She would then boil the bones in water and salt to get rid of the foul smell before drying it.

"Fish is a blessing, and fish bones symbolize emptiness," she said. *"I guess these represent our life. Whether we experience abundance or emptiness, it's all a blessing because there is a time for everything,"* she highlighted.

PSU holds 4th Gawad Parangal Para sa Mga Natatanging Mag-aaral



Pangasinan State University Lingayen Campus recorded a four-straight-finish in “Gawad Parangal para sa mga Natatanging Mag-aaral ng PSU” as another student-nominee was named as newest “Pinakanatatanging Mag-aaral” during the recently concluded awarding program held at the PSU Convention Hall on May 9, 2018.

Patrice A. Flores from the Bachelor in Secondary Education major in Physical Science is PSU’s *Pinakanatatanging Mag-aaral* for 2018. Her victory followed that of Menard P. Nava (2015), Mark Marlon C. De Vera (2016), and Mohamed Ardaniel C. Swandi (2017). Flores is the first female student to be given the title.

All nine nominees were ranked based on three categories: Academics-using the overall GWA (50%), Co-curricular activities (30%), and Panel Interview (20%). Flores, who ranked first, garnered a total rating of 81.16% with a breakdown of 45% for academics, 19.64% for co-curricular, and 16.52 for the panel interview.

Other aspirants recognized during the *Fourth Gawad Parangal para sa mga Natatanging Mag-aaral ng PSU* were Prince Ricky A. Varona of Bayambang Campus, Joemel B. Merindo of Infanta Campus, Mark Jayson M. Mariñas of Sta. Maria Campus, Dennis DG. Mendoza of San Carlos City Campus, Lyra Mhay C. Barril of Alaminos City Campus, Nestor DL. Revamontan Jr. of Asingan Campus, Eduardo R. Caballa, Jr. of Binmaley Campus, and Joshua C. Junio of Urdaneta City Campus.

The *Gawad Parangal para sa mga Natatanging Mag-aaral ng PSU* is an annual search for outstanding PSU students that aims to test the public speaking competence of the student finalists with the following criteria: ability to present/clarify/articulate ideas (45%); manifestation of critical thinking skills (20%), linguistic competence (15%), self-confidence (10%), and personal appearance (10%).

The application was open to all regular graduating students enrolled in any baccalaureate program of PSU for at least three years, who has no failing grades and must have at least a 1.75 General Weighted Average (GWA).

PSU debuts *Grammarly* utilization



To elevate the quality of written outputs, the Center for English Language (CEL) launched the utilization of licensed anti-plagiarism software, Grammarly, in Pangasinan State University last February 15, 2018 at the Jose de Venecia e-Library, Lingayen Campus.

Grammarly, the world's leading writing enhancement application, checks for more than 250 types of spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors, enhances vocabulary usage, and suggests citations with its anti-plagiarism feature as an automated grammar tutor and revision tool for academic writing.

"The use of [such] software would be the initial step to operationalize the center [CEL] because we don't have the capacity to ascertain the plagiarized text so we need software that is licensed," said Dr. Luzviminda Q. Ramos, CEL Director.

Dr. Ramos also added that the center is set to establish a standard policy in the University for undergraduate and graduate researches that *"all theses and dissertations should pass through the CEL by making use of the software."* The policy set is in response to the unit's mandate to edit theses, dissertations, modules, and test items, among others; and to offer tutorial services, and short term training courses.

Ms. Ma. Angela Navoa-Concepcion, Training and Development Manager of Hopkins International Inc. - sole distributor of licensed Grammarly, oriented 40 PSU grammarians and editors on the know-hows of Grammarly.

Concepcion emphasized that the software which also points out degree of error in grammar, is a very helpful tool in the educational arena as it highlights features like anti-plagiarism/citation audit, revision tool, grammar dashboard, context optimized synonyms, and adaptive speller check which are highly useful in ensuring standard and quality written outputs.

Meanwhile, the CEL assured that they will be manned by competent campus editors and grammarians capable of serving the needs of PSU clientele.

As a matter of fact, the center is also set to conduct series of trainings with its partner organization, American TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) Institute Philippines Inc. (International Branch) on April and August, this year.

TESOL aims to educate, certify and produce world-class English educators by providing programs at par with international standards. The training is a 120-hour course that includes research on the current trends on TESOL as well as teaching demonstration where participants will be able to practice their teaching skills in the classroom.

Dr. Ramos exalted the University President, Dr. Dexter R. Buted, who institutionalized CEL in the University, manifesting his strong desire to provide quality service in the academic community and the adoption of the anti-plagiarism software.

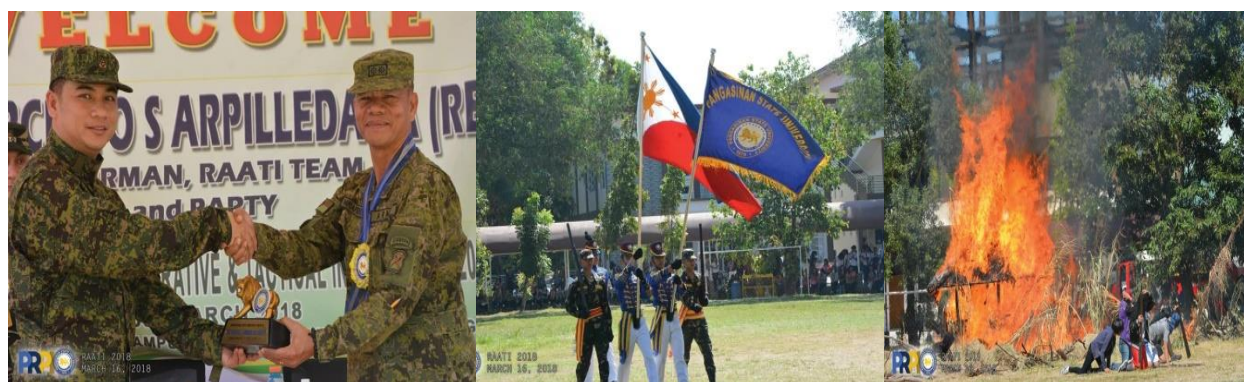

PSU is first SUC liP Silver Awardee



Pangasinan State University (PSU) was granted the Investors in People (liP) Silver Award in the recently conducted 10th liP Concourse held at the SMX Convention Center, SM Aura Premiere, Taguig City last May 4, 2018.

This marked another milestone for the university as the

first and only SUC Awardee in the country to be recognized as one of the leading organizations with excellent leadership in people management.

With PSU are three other organizations – the Republic Cement as liP Silver Awardee, Maynilad Water Services Incorporated as liP Accredited Awardee, and National Mapping and Resource Information Authority under the Department of Environment and Natural Resources as liP Accredited Awardee.

PSU proved that people management should cater not to the needs of the top management but more on its people and its primary stakeholders as a whole. Dr. Dexter R. Buted who served as one of the keynote speakers during the concourse shared before the spectators the courageous goal setting laid by his administration in building innovation through risk taking. He mentioned that upon assuming the Presidency in 2014, his team was challenged by the deficiencies they saw in the University concerning infrastructures, low performance of graduates in the examinations, and low employees' morale. This inspired him to articulate a bolder vision to become an ASEAN Premier State University in 2020.

With said vision, he emphasized the importance of having the Seven-Step Strategic Planning Process listed in order: Revisit of the Institutional Vision, Mission, Goals and Directions; SWOT Analysis and Current Performance Analysis; Formulation of Strategic Goals and Options; Preparation and Critiquing of Action Plans; Resource Allocation; Deployment of Strategic Plans; and monitoring of Strategic Plan.

His administration also crafted the eight University Strategic Goals which focused on PUS's four-fold functions in delivering excellent service to its stakeholders and workforce.

“As a leader, there is a need to consider the people in the organization, their values, their existing culture and their individual goals. So we carefully weigh the pros and cons before

we decide to do something. We analyze things, we debate with people, we brainstorm and together we act,” he highlighted.

He then presented during the event the accomplishments of the university in terms of efficient management of assets, better performance in board exams and production of topnotchers, and massive rehabilitation and construction of facilities across the nine campuses of the University.

During the awarding ceremony, Dr. Buted was joined by Dr. Paulo V. Cenas, Vice President for Administration, Mr. Ian D. Evangelista, HRMDO Director, Ms. Liezel M. Castillo, HRMDO Deputy Director, and Dr. Jenelyn V. Oboza, IIP Project Leader on stage to receive the IIP Silver Award.

Dr. Oboza shared in an interview how difficult, colorful, meaningful, and challenging the journey that PSU community has experienced before reaping success.

She said that the start was difficult as IIP was an unfamiliar subject to the PSUnians which led to several months of preparation.



“SUCs like PSU could get a holistic, productive, and well-rounded system when people know and believe their leaders, and value, respect, and recognize the contributions of every people of the institution...for PSU employees are inspired to work in a place where all live according to the values set or are expected of them. Because when you invest in people, they will repay every effort you exerted or peso spent with loyalty, hard work and trust,” she added.

The IIP is an internationally-recognized body with the mission to inspire organizations to bring out the best in its people. Among the awards that IIP gives to organizations being models of good practice in terms of people management are accredited, bronze, silver, gold, and platinum. 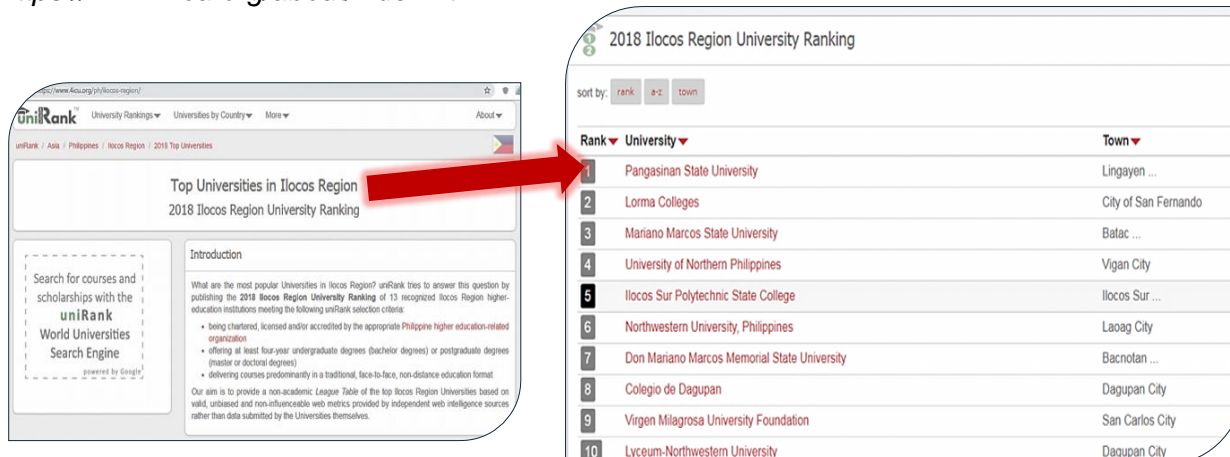

“Benchmarking activity gives opportunity to both agencies to learn new things from each other as they present their best practices and experiences,” Ms. Celeste T. Mercado, Director

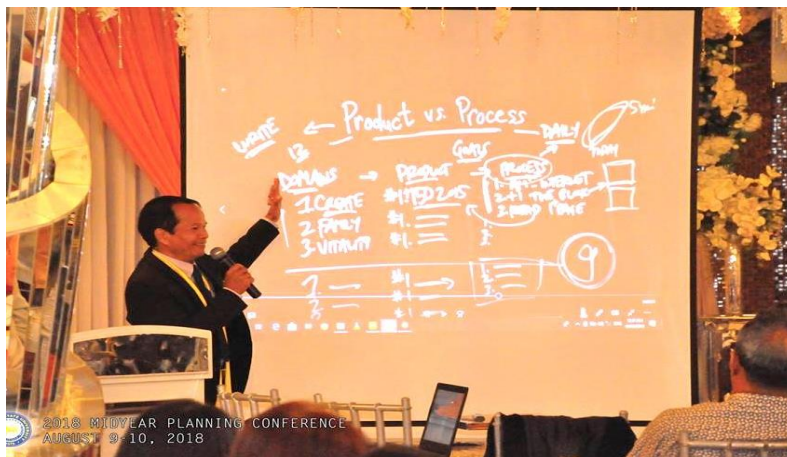


for Public Relation, Publication and Information Office (PRPIO), and in-charge of benchmarking activities mentioned.


PSU employees receive 2017 PBB

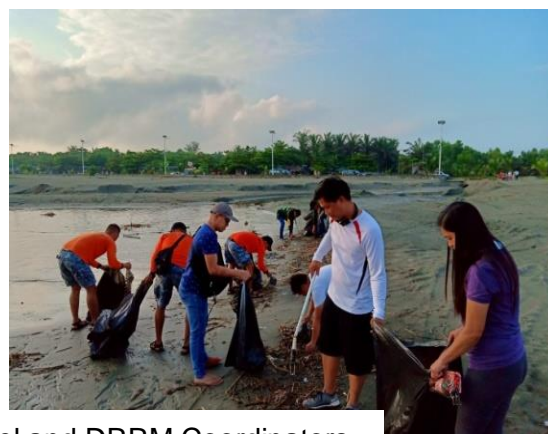

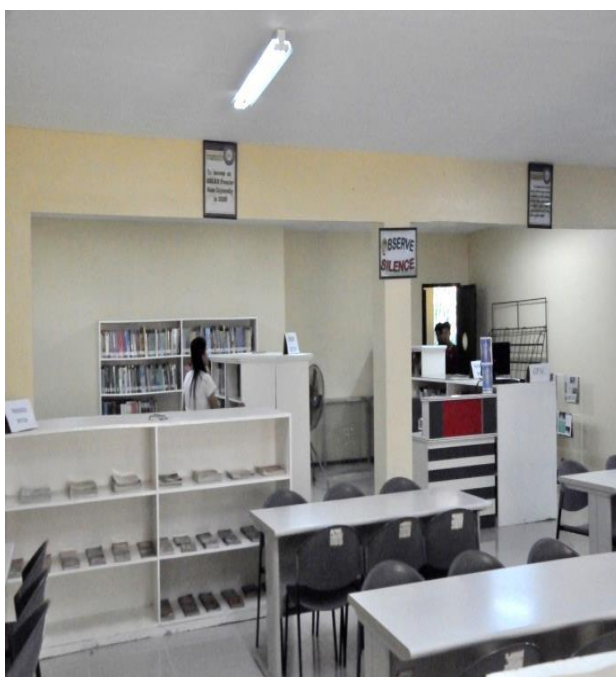


Construction of Three Storey Agro Studies Building

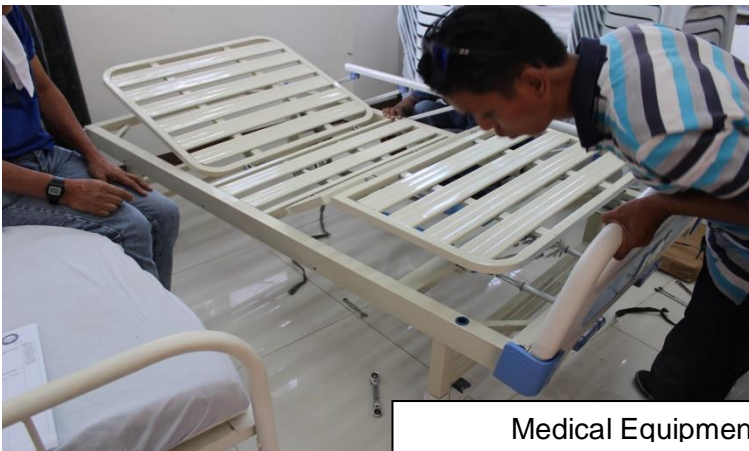

The Evaluation Meeting covered sessions that provided overview of the SEA-Teacher Project, a Program Evaluation on pertinent issues, problems and solutions about the project, and discussion on collaboration, additional agreements and signing of agreement with various partner universities.

The event ended with a dinner hosted by the Provincial Government of Pangasinan.

Foreign students complete SEA-Teacher and SEA-TVET Projects in PSU

Fifty-two students from Southeast Asian (SEA) countries were awarded with Certificates of Completion by Pangasinan State University (PSU) as they successfully completed the SEA-Teacher and SEA-Technical and Vocational Education and Training (SEA-TVET).



The awarding ceremony took place during the concluding program held at the Narcisco Ramos Sports and Civic Center (NRSCC) Gymnasium in Lingayen, Pangasinan on February 14, 2018.

The SEA-Teacher Project aims to provide opportunity for pre-service student teachers to acquire teaching experiences in other universities in SEA

counties. While the SEA-TVET Project targets to develop students in various languages, advanced skills and knowledge, as well as increases global competitiveness, and employability of the participants. The said projects are under the Pre-Service Student Exchange Program in Southeast Asia.

Dr. Manolito C. Manuel, Vice President for Academic Affairs, stressed three significant cores of the two projects during the delivery of his inspirational talk. He primarily stated that the projects served as avenues in bringing out the global competitiveness of students among SEA countries. He considered global competitiveness - the ability to live and survive outside one's country as one of the crucial 21st century skill.

Dr. Manuel also recognized the collaborative efforts and expertise rendered by the industry and agency partners in the country in the fulfillment of the objectives of the SEA-TVET Project.

Mr. Hanif Addienda, a SEA-Teacher delegate taking up Biology Education in Jambi University in Indonesia, shared some of the practices he observed in the Philippine educational system which he finds better when compared with the educational practices of his country.

Addienda emphasized that Filipino teachers practice two-way learning where students could participate in class discussions contrary to the practice in his country.

"With the teaching practices I learned in the Philippines specifically in PSU Bayambang, I am going to adopt these in our country so that when I am already a teacher I am going to become closer to my students by engaging them to be more participative during my class discussions, (sic)" he proudly shared.

Meanwhile, Biyan Rolichusnandar, an Indonesian Informatics Engineering student under the SEA-TVET project also shared that he learned creative designing and web developing at the Pixel Hub in Dagupan City during his training.

In the forum, President Buted presented the 2017 University Accomplishment Report while the Vice Presidents laid out the plans for 2018.

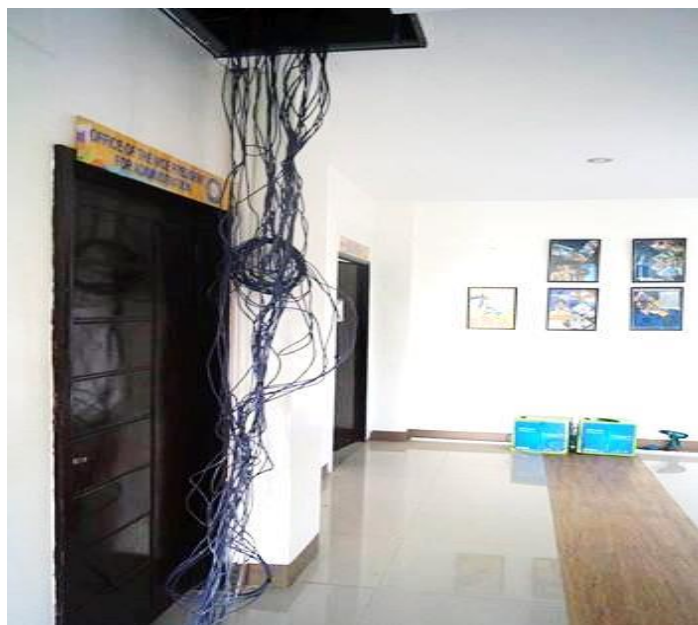


PSU assists NEDA RO1's Teambuilding Activities
